A. Call to Order - Mayor Robbie Skinner called the regular meeting of the Buckhannon City Council

for Thursday, October 21, 2021, to order and asked all present to join him in a Moment of Silence. He then led all those in attendance in the Pledge to the Flag of the United States of America.

B. Recognized Guests

B.1 Dr. Joseph Reed-Upshur County Health Department-Harm Reduction Program - The Mayor announced that he had been notified by Dr. Reed that he would not be able to attend the meeting.

B.2 Dennis Cortes-Upshur County Parks & Recreation Board - The Mayor recognized Dennis Cortes who is a City Representative on the Upshur County Parks & Recreation Board who provided the following report to City Council:

**REPORT FROM UPSHUR COUNTY
PARKS & RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD
For 11 Oct. 2021**

In attendance were; Brandon Williams, Dennis P. Cortes, Julia Kastner, Josh Hinchman, Rachel Weber with non-board members, Adam Brumley and Kristy Tenney. Absent were J.J. Ford and Mike Donato.

After the minutes were read there was a TRAIL UPDATE: a \$3,000.00 donation was made by a private citizen. Also, the Upshur County Trails raised \$560.00 in T-shirt sales. The last public work day for the trail in September had 12 college volunteers helping, the next work day is scheduled for 17 October 2021. They will start preparing a new trail segment. Trail volunteer hours for 2021 are at 548.5 hours with 38 volunteers, so far. Four individuals have contributed 325 of these hours. The section of progressive drops is currently on hold.

The Fairy-Gnome trail will be taken up by 17 October and will be returned in the spring of 2022. (A note from Dennis, this part is not in the minutes but this needs to be said; please do NOT let your children play with the items in the fairy-gnome trail. These spots are assigned to individual persons or families. The displays are not toys; they can cost a fair amount of money to display. They are meant for your viewing pleasure only.)

Adam Brumley reported that motorcycles have been seen on the bike and hiking trails. He spoke with one of them and informed that rider that these trails are for non-motorized use only and that law enforcement SHALL be involved in the future.

Disc golf is ready to go with signs added to the tees. A sign with the rules has been installed near the first tee. There is hope that a disc golf tournament will take place here in the spring. Once the Upshur County Trail maps are updated, the disc golf course will be added to the map.

Tennis court resurfacing quotes are being obtained. Once they are available they will be taken to the Upshur County B.O.E.

In pool news; the maintenance department is finishing work on the baby pool. Also there is a possibility that the diving boards will be replaced. The pool will be painted in the spring and the lockers will probably be removed.

A new electronic gate is being made for the park area. And lastly, we are currently looking into automated doorknob for the bathrooms.

The next meeting is scheduled for 08 November 2021 at 5:30 PM in the County Commission building. These meetings are open to the public.

Mayor Skinner then recognized Matt Kerner who had signed up to address the Council. Mr. Kerner read to the City Council from a petition that objects to the appointment of Sheila Sines to fill the unexpired term of a recently vacated council seat. He reported that to date the petition had been signed by about 250 local persons. Within the petition, "We" is used often and Council member Rylands asked if the word "We" was referring to the people who had signed the petition and Mr. Kerner indicated yes. Mr. Kerner then presented the Mayor with a copy of the petition, signatures and screen shots of social media posts made by Mrs. Sines that he had referenced during his presentation.

In September of 2021 the Buckhannon city council appointed a woman named Sheila Sines to fill the unexpired term of a recently vacated council seat. This happened without even considering anyone else and with the full knowledge of the remaining council members that Sines is well known for posting racist, bigoted, and xenophobic posts on social media, even going so far as to encourage and support calls for violence to be carried out against those who hold views different than hers. When city employee Laura Foulks went to a council meeting to question that decision, she was fired from her job the following day.

We would demand her (Sines) resignation and for the members who voted for her to acknowledge that they used poor judgement in how they filled that seat.

The city ordinances and state code for filling elected municipal positions in the event of a vacancy are extremely vague. We also demand that the city create an ordinance to address the filling of vacancies that at a minimum contains provisions that include:

- 1. Public notice of the vacancy.
 - 2. An opportunity for everyone who is interested to apply
 - 3. A fair opportunity for everyone interested to be interviewed and considered for appointment.
- That will ensure that openings are handled uniformly moving forward.

We also demand that all elected officials and city employees undergo regular training to ensure cultural competency including an understanding of poverty, gender issues, race, gender identity and sexual orientation.

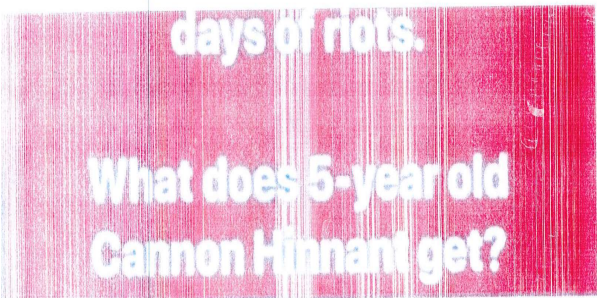

C.1 Public Works Director- Jerry Arnold - Jerry Arnold presented the following to City Council:

**Buckhannon City Council
Public Works Director Report
October 21, 2021
Jerry Arnold**

Director:

- I am working on razing structures. We have completed the KOP house and the bank drive thru. We will begin demolition on 31 Upper Drive next week.

Street:

- The crews continue to work on sidewalks on N. Spring Street.

Sewer:

- Crew 1- Finishing up some drop inlets on N. Spring Street.
- Crew 2 – Installing a couple sewer taps on N. Kanawha Street.
- Maintenance Crew- Replaced flow meter at landfill and performed routine maintenance.
- Plant- All tests are within normal range.

Water:

- Continue flushing hydrants.
- Installed a section of new 4" water main along S. Kanawha St. near Feola's Greenhouse.

Waste:

- Nothing new to report.

Engineer:

- Tennerton Booster Station – Preliminary layout and upgrade discussions with Potesta have begun.
- Gateway West Phase III Construction – Wheeling / Charleston Diocese is wanting to discuss the purchasing of property at the bottom of Amelia Drive to allow for the installation of the pedestrian refuge island. This property would eventually be transferred to the WVDOH. However, the WVDOH will not pay for the property. Trying to contact the WVDOH's Project Manager to discuss this new development.
- WVWC Solar Array Project – Permit drawings have been reviewed and approved. Perimeter fencing has been installed around the project site.
- City Hall Roof Replacement – Materials have been ordered for the project and are due to arrive at the end of October. The contractor anticipates starting the first week of November and completing the project within two weeks.
- Vicksburg Utility Development – The developers have made the water and sanitary sewer line extension deposits. The developers are going to develop four lots (out of 17) at this time. The 2"Ø waterline will be installed prior to the sanitary sewer line as the question as to who owns two streets near the development must be resolved prior to the installation of the sanitary sewer line.
- Introduced Potesta & Associates (Engineers) and The Mills Group (Architectural Sub-consultant) to Charles W. Gibson Library and the Stockert Youth & Community Center Boards to begin discussion on their projects.

A Q&A regarding the completion of the Sanitary Department work on N. Kanawha Street, as well as the Spring Street sidewalks and paving took place, led by Recorder Sanders, with Mr. Arnold. Mr. Arnold explained that the Sanitary Department's work on N. Kanawha Street is complete; the Street Department is working to complete the sidewalks on N. Spring Street and plan to pave N. Spring Street before the asphalt plants close for the season. The sidewalk work on N. Kanawha Street will continue through the winter and the plan is to have that project complete and be ready to pave N. Kanawha Street in the spring.

Good morning,

We are writing to inform you of a subsequent distribution of American Rescue Plan Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funding for Non-Entitlement Units that has been awarded to your non-entitlement unit (NEU) of local government in the amount of \$1,894.32. This subsequent distribution is from amounts left in the NEU fund because other West Virginia NEUs either declined their distribution or were non-responsive. The US Treasury directs the State to re-allocate any funds not accepted by any NEUs for distribution among the NEUs that did respond and accept their funds, up to eligible amounts per NEU.

This amount should be included with your previous allocation and should be considered as part of your total NEU allocation. This is part of tranche 1 and you will receive this amount again as part of your second tranche.

In 2022, each NEU will receive their second tranche of NEU funding which shall either equal the amount received for both your initial distribution and this subsequent distribution or nearly equal the amount if the distribution was unable to be evenly divided between first and second tranche. It is possible that tranche 2 could be one cent more or one cent less than tranche 1 in this circumstance. Please keep in mind that this subsequent distribution is subject to reporting requirements to the United States Department of Treasury under the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery funds as discussed in previous communications from our office.



The overall cost of equipment has increased approximately 15% over the past year, and delivery times have also increased due to supply chain delays. The grant funds have been completely applied to the purchase and installation of (2) ADA compliant platform lifts. Together, the cost of the lifts is \$37,106. One lift will provide ADA access to the basement and the other lift will provide ADA access to the 2nd floor.

ORDINANCE NO. 453 OF THE CITY OF BUCKHANNON, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 242 OF THE CITY OF BUCKHANNON, PROVIDING FOR THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS OF THE JUDGE OF CITY OF BUCKHANNON MUNICIPAL COURT AND MAKING CERTAIN STYLISTIC CHANGES

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Buckhannon, by Ordinance No. 242 adopted on August 20, 1987, established certain requirements for the Judge of the Municipal Court; particularly, that the Judge of the Municipal Court, at all times during his or her service as Judge, shall be a bona fide resident of the City of Buckhannon; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Buckhannon wishes to revisit that requirement in light of the growth and integration of the greater Buckhannon-Upshur community, particularly outside of the municipal limits of the City; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council now deems it to be reasonable and appropriate, and in the best interest of the current and future operation of the City and the Municipal Court, to amend the residency requirements of the Judge thereof to permit any bona-fide resident of Upshur County, West Virginia to serve in that role; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is also to update certain language contained in Ordinance No. 242.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUCKHANNON, AS FOLLOWS:

a) That Article 3, Section 3-2 of Ordinance No. 242 of the City of Buckhannon is amended to read as follows:

The Judge of the Municipal Court, at the time of his or her appointment and at all times during the term of his or her office, shall be a bona fide resident of Upshur County, West Virginia. In the event that the Judge of the Municipal Court moves his or her residence from Upshur County, West Virginia during his or her term of office, then he or she shall automatically vacate the office.

- b) That all other provisions of Ordinance No. 242 remain in full force and effect.

ARTICLE II - EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be deemed effective thirty (30) days following the second (2nd) reading, passage and adoption by the Council of the City of Buckhannon, i.e., November 20, 2021.

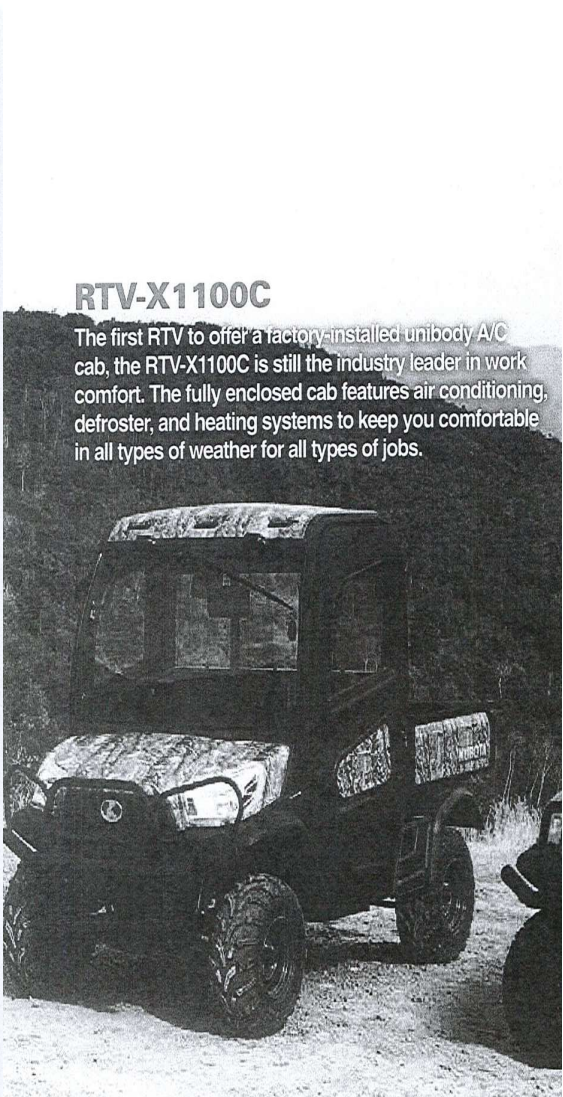

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into by the City of Buckhannon (hereinafter “Buckhannon”) and the Upshur County Board of Education (hereinafter the “BOE”). Whereas, the parties have a common interest and goal of promoting youth arts education and cultural offerings within Buckhannon, WV, and therefore the parties agree as follows:

- (1) BOE will employ an individual to fill the position of Fine Arts and Culture Facilitator/Educator (hereinafter referred to as “Educator”). BOE will be responsible for advertising for the position of and selecting the individual to fill this position. Said selection will be based upon the BOE’s policies and procedures as set forth under the law. BOE will be responsible for paying the salary, benefits, unemployment obligation, worker compensation obligations, and any other costs generally associated with an employee.
- (2) City is responsible for employing an individual to fill the position of Managing Director. City will be responsible for advertising for the position of and selecting the individual to fill this position. Said selection will be based upon the City’s policies and procedures as set forth under the law. City will be responsible for paying the salary, benefits, unemployment obligation, worker compensation obligations, and any other costs generally associated with an employee.
- (3) The job responsibilities of the Educator will be as set forth in the attached job posting attached hereto as Exhibit A. It is generally understood that the Educator will be responsible for the implementation and execution of youth art educational programs at the Colonial Arts Center. Said Educator will be stationed primarily at the Colonial Arts Center.
- (4) Managing Director shall be generally responsible for the daily administrative duties of the Colonial Arts Center.
- (5) City will provide support spaces and utilities as reasonably necessary for Educator to execute said youth art education programs.at no cost to the BOE.
- (6) Funding for youth art educational programming and opportunities implemented at the Colonial Arts Center shall be shared by the BOE and City, as negotiated on a case-by-case basis.
- (7) Educator and Managing Director shall work in coordination with one another.
- (8) The Colonial Arts Center Board shall serve as the liaison between the City and BOE.
- (9) The parties agree to indemnify and hold harmless one another for the actions and/or omissions of the others’ employees as well as from any injury or harm sustained by said employees.
- (10) The parties to the Memorandum of Understanding agree that each party providing an employee to work at the Colonial Arts Center, shall contribute to ensuring the Colonial Arts Center serves as a community arts hub, facilitating and providing venues for creative and educational opportunities for students, artists, and audience members through diverse programming.

He also felt that we should look into CAPRA, which is the Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies and provides a management system of best practices, much like CALEA does for law enforcement.
- **Council Member Thomas** – Mr. Thomas agreed with Mr. Rylands about looking at efforts to dedicate more resources towards our Parks and Recreations facilities. He also reiterated the importance of having community involvement with how to spend the future receipts from our City’s 1% Sales Tax including having Town Hall meetings to allow for the exchange of ideas.
- **Council Member Reger** - Mr. Reger felt great to be out of the house and at the meeting in person.
- **Council Member Lewis-Sines** – Mrs. Lewis-Sines also commented that it was good to see Jack Reger at the meeting and that she truly loved the community.
- **City Recorder Sanders** - Mr. Sanders followed-up on the comments by Mr. Rylands regarding the possibility of the City having its own Parks and Recreations Director. He noted that the idea had also been discussed at the recent Buckhannon Planning Commission meeting and that they had appointed an ad hoc committee to explore the recreational needs of the community. Mr. Sanders pointed out that the Parks are currently under the Street Department and that department stays very busy. Any help that we can provide the department would be beneficial to the community overall.

H. Mayor’s Comments and Announcements – Mayor Skinner spoke about the retirement of Bryan “Buck” Samples who had been with the City of Buckhannon for a total of 43 years. His most recent position had been the Superintendent of the Sanitary Department. Earlier in the day, during the Sanitary Department Board meeting, the Mayor presented Buck with an engraved clock commemorating his many years of service to the City of Buckhannon and the customers of the Buckhannon Sanitary Department.

The Mayor then called for a motion to enter an Executive Session per WV Code § 6-9A-4- Property matters.

At 7:51 PM, a motion to enter in an Executive Session was made by Thomas/Lewis-Sines. Motion carried.

At 8:29 PM, a motion to leave the Executive Session was made by Rylands/Lewis-Sines. Motion carried. A discussion on property matters had taken place with no decisions being made.

I. Adjournment

Motion to adjourn at 8:30 PM was made by Sanders/Lewis-Sines. Motion carried.
