Without objection, *F.6 Approval Mutual Aid Agreement between Buckhannon Police Department & the Weston Police Department* was moved to the table for discussion and/or vote.

Lt. Loudin provided an overview of the agreement.

Motion to approve the Mutual Aid Agreement between the Buckhannon Police Department & the Weston Police Department and authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement was made by Sanders/Thomas. Motion carried.

#### MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 19 day of September 20 22 by and between the Buckhannon Police Department and the Weston Police Department;

WHEREAS, the statutory provisions of Chapter 15, Article 10, Section 2-4 of the West Virginia Code specifically provide that each political subdivision within the State is empowered to make and enter into MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS with other agencies of the state criminal justice system, in order to most effectively allocate law enforcement and other public safety services; and,

WHEREAS, the undersigned law enforcement departments as parties to this agreement desire to realize additional law enforcement protection for the citizens of their political subdivisions which they serve during emergency and other situations by making the most efficient use possible of the law enforcement personnel of the political subdivisions, and specifically of the two (2) aforementioned law enforcement departments; and,

WHEREAS, each of the law enforcement departments hereto agree to, when practicable, aid and assist each other in the event that emergency and other situations should occur, by the interchange of law enforcement services and the exchange of criminal investigative and other information; and,

WHEREAS, the parties hereto further invoke this voluntary aid and assistance agreement on a continuing basis for the interchange of law enforcement services in their day to-day operations, particularly relating to drug and violent crime investigations; and,

WHEREAS, it is reasonable, necessary, and proper that this written MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT be executed to formalize the agreement for the interchange of such mutual aid on a municipal, countywide, and regional basis.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED** by and between each and all of the law enforcement departments hereto, as follows:

- 1) As used herein, the phrase "Emergency Situation" means an actual or potential condition within the jurisdiction of one or more of the law enforcement departments that poses an immediate threat to life or property that exceeds the resources and capability of the jurisdiction(s) to successfully bring the situation under control.
- 2) Each department agrees that in the event of any emergency situation, each other party to this Agreement shall furnish such personnel, equipment, facilities, or services as is, in the opinion of the assisting member, available. Provided, however, that each party
  - d. Transportation of arrestees
  - e. Complete proper arrest warrant and prosecutorial procedures, and f. Court duty pertaining to arrests.
  - In any emergency situation where the MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT has been invoked, radio communications shall be established between all responding departments.
- 9) Each department providing personnel under the scope of this Agreement agrees to be exclusively responsible for the wages, pension, and workers' compensation benefits incurred by their own personnel as a result of any emergency situation.
- 10) Each department providing equipment under the scope of this Agreement agrees to be exclusively responsible for any damage or destruction resulting thereto as a consequence of acting in response to this Agreement.
- 11) Each department shall be responsible for maintaining and providing to each other on a semi-annual basis, from the date of both parties signing the Agreement, an accurate account of available resources including, but not limited to, available personnel per shift, equipment, and specialized units.
- 12) All parties shall develop and update on a regular basis, a plan providing for the effective mobilization of all of its resources, equipment, and facilities to cope with any type of emergency situation or unusual occurrence.
- 13) Mutual aid operational directives shall be cooperatively developed and updated on a regular basis by the parties hereto, and are operative between the parties in accordance with the provisions of such directives.
- 14) All parties agree to meet on a semi-annual basis to review all mutual aid plans and the provisions of this Agreement.

15) This Agreement shall become effective as to each party's law enforcement department when approved and executed by that department's political subdivision's governing body, and a copy of said Agreement is filed with the office of the Circuit Clerk of the

county in which the law enforcement departments involved operate. The Agreement shall remain in effect as between all parties until terminated in writing. Either party to this Agreement may terminate participation in this Agreement upon written notice addressed to the designated law enforcement officials of the other signatory law enforcement departments which are party to this Agreement.

16) The execution of this Agreement shall not give rise to any liability or responsibility

for failure to respond to any request for assistance made pursuant to this Agreement.

reserves the right to refuse to render assistance or to recall any or all rendered assistance, whenever it is determined that such actions are necessary for the continued protection of the assisting department's primary jurisdiction.

3) The following officers shall have the authority to invoke this agreement;

Police Department

- A. Chief of Police
- B. Deputy Chief of Police
- C. Captain
- D. Lieutenant
- E. On Duty Shift Supervisor

All parties shall provide each other with an updated list at least semiannually, specifying the name, position, telephone number, and any other pertinent contact information of the above officials.

- 4) In order to invoke mutual aid under the provisions of this agreement, the designated official from the requesting department shall be required to contact the designated official of the responding party by telephone, radio, in writing, in person, or by any other reasonable communication. The responding department may request such information from the requesting department as is necessary to confirm the emergency situation and assess the type and amount of assistance that shall be provided.
- 5) During an emergency situation, all personnel from responding agencies shall report and work under the direction and supervision of the designated supervisor of the requesting agency at the emergency site. Provided, however, that at all times, the officers shall adhere to the policies and procedures of their own department, and shall only be required to render assistance, whenever it is determined that such action is not violative of their own departmental policies and procedures.
- 6) Personnel responding to any call for mutual aid outside of their appointed jurisdiction shall possess those law enforcement powers as provided for by the State of West Virginia.
- 7) In the event of any mutual aid request involving actual or potential mass arrests, responding department law enforcement officers shall make such arrests only for offenses directly related to the incident, and shall assist in the processing of arrestees as follows:
  - a. Identification of arrestees
  - b. Control of property obtained from arrestees
  - c. Completion of arrest reports

This Agreement shall not be construed as or deemed to be an Agreement for the benefit of any third party.

17) All departments to this Agreement expressly agree to: (1) waive any and all claims against all the other departments hereto that may arise out of their activities performed outside their primary jurisdictions pursuant to this Agreement, and (2) indemnify, defend, save, and hold harmless the other departments to this Agreement from any and all claims asserted by any third parties or personal injury that may arise out of the activities of the other parties performed pursuant to this Agreement, and outside their primary jurisdictions under this Agreement.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF**, this Agreement has been executed and approved and is effective and operative as to each of the departments as herein provided.

ORDINANCE NO. 461 OF THE CITY OF BUCKHANNON, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NOS. 320, 350, AND 432, REDUCING THE SIZE OF THE CITY'S STOCKERT YOUTH AND COMMUNITY CENTER BOARD OF DIRECTORS BY DECREASING THE NUMBER OF AT-LARGE MEMBERS; PROVIDING FOR THE BOARD'S OPERATIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR THE FREQUENCY OF BOARD MEETINGS

WHEREAS, since July 1, 2004, the City of Buckhannon has exclusively owned and operated the Stockert Youth Center, subsequently renamed by the City of Buckhannon as the Stockert Youth and Community Center, sometimes hereinafter referred to as "SYCC," located at 79 East Main Street, in Buckhannon; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Buckhannon Ordinance No. 320, the City formally established the CC board of directors consisting of nine (9) members including three (3) at-large members; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Buckhannon Ordinance No. 350, the City expanded the membership of the SYCC board of directors from nine (9) members to ten (10); and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Buckhannon Ordinance No. 432, the City expanded the membership of the SYCC board of directors from ten (10) members to eleven (11); and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Buckhannon now desires to reduce the SYCC board of directors, to provide for a board of eleven (9) members, including three (3) at-large members; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it reasonable, necessary, and appropriate to reduce the number of members of the SYCC Board of Directors and amend Ordinance Nos. 320, 350, and 432 in order that the community's Stockert Youth and Community Center – and hence the youth of Buckhannon and Upshur County – may best be served.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUCKHANNON, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I - COMPOSITION OF SYCC BOARD OF DIRECTORS; COMPENSATION; CONDUCT OF MEETINGS; AND QUORUM:

(A) The City Council shall be advised as to the management and operation of the Stockert Youth and Community Center by a Board of nine (9) Directors, all of whom shall have the privilege of voting on

any matters coming before the Board, the composition of which shall be determined in the following manner:

- (1) The City Council shall appoint three (3) Directors who shall be:
  - (A) the Mayor of the City of Buckhannon, who shall serve as Chair;
  - (B) the City Recorder of the City of Buckhannon, who shall serve as Vice Chair, and who shall conduct and preside over Board meetings in the absence of the Mayor. In any event whereby the City Recorder is acting as Mayor, then the City Recorder shall nominate another member of the City Council to serve as a Director, which nomination shall then be confirmed by the City Council; and,
- (C) one member of the City Council who shall be nominated by the Mayor, and confirmed by the City Council.
- (2) The Upshur County Commission shall appoint one (1) Director who shall be one of the duly seated Commissioners serving on the Commission, said member to be appointed by the Commission, and whose term shall be for that member's term of office or until otherwise designated by the County Commission.
- (3) The Upshur County Board of Education shall appoint one (1) Director who shall be one of the duly seated members of the Board of Education, said member to be appointed by the Board of Education, and whose term shall be for that member's term of office or until otherwise designated by the Board of Education.
- (4) West Virginia Wesleyan College shall appoint one (1) Director who shall be either an administrator or faculty member of the College who is actively involved with the student service and volunteer programs at the College, said member to be appointed by the President of the College, and who shall serve for a one-year term, from each July 1 through the ensuing June 30, but who may be reappointed by the College's President.
- (5) The Mayor shall nominate three (3) at-large members from the community, at least two of whom shall be residents of the City of Buckhannon, subject to the confirmation of the City Council, which three (3) at-large members shall be appointed to serve for a term of two (2) years each. Two (2) at-large members shall serve with their two-year terms expiring on June 30 of even numbered years, and one (1) at-large member shall serve with his or her two-year terms expiring on June 30 of odd numbered years. Nothing herein shall prevent any at-large member from being reappointed indefinitely to the SYCC Board of Directors, and further nothing herein shall prevent any at-large member from having affiliation or involvement with any of the City, the County, the Board of Education, or West Virginia Wesleyan College.
- (6) Notwithstanding term of service designations, all of the three (3) at-large municipal appointees shall be deemed to serve at the will and pleasure of the City Council, may be appointed without regard to political affiliation, and may be removed at the will and pleasure of the City Council.
- (7) In the event of any death, resignation, inability or unwillingness to serve further on the part of any City Council selected member, except the Mayor, the City Council shall then appoint a successor member to serve for the unexpired term. In the event of any death, resignation, inability or unwillingness to serve further on the part of any County Commission, Board of Education, or College selected member, such appointing authority shall then promptly appoint a successor member to serve for the unexpired term, and shall further promptly apprise the City Council in writing of its successor member appointment.
- (8) The members of the SYCC Board of Directors shall not receive any compensation for their service on the Board, however, Directors shall be entitled to reimbursement for their expenses as are approved in advance by the Board.
- (9) In addition to being a voting member of the Board, the City Recorder shall serve as the secretary or clerk of the Board, and shall keep the minutes of all meetings, which minutes shall be maintained for public inspection at Buckhannon's City Hall. Various City officials, including but not limited to City Engineers, Street Commissioner, City Attorney and City Technology Officer shall be available to attend SYCC Board meetings upon the Board's request.

- (10) Meetings shall be convened upon the call of the Chair no less frequently than quarterly, and in accordance with the West Virginia Open Governmental Proceedings Act, the date and time of which meetings shall be communicated to the City Council during an open session of the Council, and posted at City Hall
- (11) All meetings shall be open to the public and conducted pursuant to the West Virginia Open Governmental Proceedings Act and other open meetings statutes, as said statutes are set forth pursuant to Chapter 6, Article 9A, Section 1 et seq. of the West Virginia Code, and as may be amended.
- (12) The attendance at any meeting of any five (5) of the nine (9) members of the Board, including ex officio members, shall be deemed to constitute a quorum.
- (13) The Board may seek the guidance, subject to advance approval by the City Council, of such engineers, architects, inspectors, managers, attorneys and such other individuals as in the Board's judgment may be necessary to assist the Board in carrying out its functions.

### ARTICLE II - SUPERSEDING PROVISIONS:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall supersede all other Ordinances and/or Resolutions of the City of Buckhannon conflicting with the provisions hereof insofar as the City's ownership, operation and composition of the board of directors of The Stockert Youth and Community Center are concerned. All other provisions of previously enacted Ordinances or Resolutions not amended hereby shall be deemed as remaining and continuing in full force and effect.

ARTICLE III - EFFECTIVE DATE: Pursuant to the Charter of the City of Buckhannon, this Ordinance shall be deemed effective by the Council of the City of Buckhannon thirty (30) days following the second (2nd) reading, passage and adoption by the Council of the City of Buckhannon, i.e., December 3, 2022.



# **G.** Comments and Announcements:

• Pamela Bucklew: Mrs. Bucklew requested \$3,000 to \$4,000 for additional holiday decorations in Jawbone Park including having a real Christmas tree in the park. She discussed possibly removing a tree from the grounds at Stockert Youth & Community Center (replacing it) and using it as the first annual live tree in Jawbone Park. Discussion took place and it was decided to have a Holiday Decoration Committee meeting set for Tuesday, October 25, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in Council Chambers to prepare recommendations for a future Council meeting. She also complimented BCT on their successful production of CLUE in the Colonial Arts Center. She reported they will have two encore presentations on October 30th.

- **David McCauley:** Mr. McCauley spoke about the recent Water Board meeting with the Upshur County PSD's and felt that it went very well. He mentioned the Boooockhannon Community Halloween Events and noted a lot of work had gone into the planning, so he encouraged members of the community to take part in them. He then noted that he had a statement to read. Once he began with the statement it was apparent to be in reference to a personal matter, which prompted Mayor Skinner to interrupt and advise it was not appropriate in this setting.
