A. Call to Order - The meeting was called to order by Mayor Skinner who then asked all to join him in a Moment of Silence followed by the Pledge to the Flag of the United States of America.

B. Recognized Guests

B.1 Allysa Murphy, BUMS – Without objection, Mayor Skinner moved *G.1* BUMS Inside Out Project - Approval Temporary Placement of Portraits on Sidewalks (Parade Route) to the table for discussion and/or vote. Mayor Skinner then recognized Allysa Murphy, from the Buckhannon Upshur Middle School (BUMS), who provided an overview of the request, which is described in detail within the meeting packet (see agenda item G.1). A discussion that included Ms. Murphy, Board Members, Brad Hawkins and Jerry Arnold took place ending with the agreement that a

mockup of the art will be provided to the City for testing. Once this happens, the matter will be placed on a future CPWB Agenda and will be consider then. The matter was therefore tabled with no action being taken.

To Whom It May Concern:

Buckhannon-Upshur Middle School would like permission to post the photos for the Inside Out Project in a public space. We have several possible locations in the attachment as alternatives, however, we are requesting permission to do the project on the sidewalks of the parade route, beginning at McDonald's and ending between Main Street and West Virginia Wesleyan College.

If our Action Proposal is accepted by the Inside Out Project, they would send us large, printed portrait photos of all of those taking part in the project. Once we have the pictures, we will use glue (wheat paste and/or wallpaper glue) to post the images on the sidewalks along the parade route. These images will wear off over time with weather and all materials used are biodegradable and will wear off over time.

This is an art installation for the entire community. Our goal is to post the images right before the Upshur County Strawberry Festival in May of 2023 with some kind of kick-off and field trip, possibly, in order to post all of the work on the sidewalks. We will have involvement from West Virginia Wesleyan College, the Arts director of Upshur School, PBL (Project-Based Learning) organizations, ART26201, Buckhannon-Upshur High School, and hopefully City and County support.

Inside Out Project:

"After winning the TED Prize on March 2, 2011, the French-artist JR launched the Inside Out Project, in his first TED Talk. Using his own artistic practice as inspiration, this participatory platform helps individuals and communities to make a statement by displaying large-scale black and white portraits in public spaces. Through their "Actions," communities around the world have sparked collaborations and conversations.

Over the past decade, almost 500,000 people spanning across 148 countries and territories have participated in the Inside Out Project. Thanks to participants' donations, the project has reached all of the continents, with over 2,000 actions created. Actions have revolved around a range of topics: diversity, community, feminism, racism, climate change, education, children's rights, and art are just a few of them. Posters are displayed in outdoor spaces that are visible to the public. These Group Action installations are documented, and shared online.

Together we can turn the world inside out!"






