B. Recognized Guests:

B.1 James Powell, Loudin Insurance: Mr. Powell discussed the specialized appraisal (on file at City Hall) and insurance changes. The insurance wanted a specialized appraisal on the Water Plant. Replacement costs are more accurate with buildings such as homes, but more difficult with buildings such as plants because of the inner workings. Mr. Powell recommends going with the experts and their recommendations. The recommended changes will reduce the appraisal value; most of the reduction comes from water tanks. Business/personal property values will increase. Premium may change 10-15%. Mr. Powell also recommends appraising every 5-6 years.

Council member McCauley asked if the City should be concerned about fire hydrant pressure? Yes, it should be on our radar.

Thank you to Mr. Powell for his time and assistance.

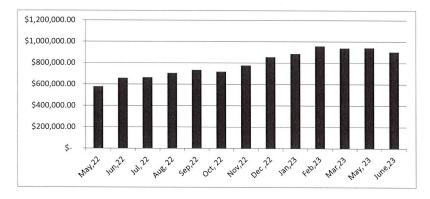

Also in attendance were Secretary/Treasurer Laurie Adams and Chief Operator Jeff May.

Minutes from the previous Regular Meeting were approved, a motion was made by Marcella, motion carried. The Treasurer's Report was presented along with the past month's bank statements, they were accepted for audit. The Truck Report was presented and approved. The Mt Hope Monthly Report was presented and approved. The Water Loss Report was reviewed and approved. Jeff presented the Operator's Report. Pictures of an issue with a customer's driveway were discussed. The board will discuss it further, once the customer makes their actual request known in writing or attends a meeting. The leak adjustments presented were approved, a motion was made by Nicholas, motion carried.

An update on the Water Improvement/Maintenance Project was discussed. The Preliminary Engineering Report was completed and shared with the board members by email. The request for funding through IJDC has passed Executive Director Review. The work on the welded tank at Wilfong Hill has been completed by Complete Restoration. After the tank is sanitized and refilled, a water sample will have to be taken. A motion was made by Nicholas, to pay Spike Tenney \$100 to assist in gathering that sample, motion passed. A motion was made by Marcella to pay the Complete Restoration invoice out of the Depreciation fund and open a new account for depreciation that will have a lower minimum balance, motion carried. The valves previously decided to be installed by Atlas, will not be installed. Atlas ran into difficulty accessing the area. A motion was made by Nicholas to no longer pursue installing the valves

and if they cannot be returned, to advertise them for sale with other water utilities, motion carried. The Extreme Endeavors invoice for tank level monitoring was discussed. A motion was made by Marcella to approve paying the Extreme Endeavors invoice, motion carried. The board discussed options of hiring a part-time field technician now that Matthew Orsburn has left as of May 12, 2023. If any of the possibilities discussed do not work out, we will likely advertise publicly. Jeff's medical leave is no longer immediate, it is however, important to get someone hired to learn the system. Laurie discussed the financial issues we have experienced the past couple of months. The high water bills from the City of Buckhannon, large leaks and unexpected, added costs for the welded tanks maintenance have put a strain on the finances. A motion was made by Debbie to withdraw the amount of our USDA loans in June, from Debt Reserve, if necessary, motion passed.

Filling of swimming pools this month has made it hard to determine how much that repair helped with our water loss. We continue to try and locate leaks on the system to help alleviate the water loss and bring down our City water bill.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned on motion made by Dave Burr and seconded by Wendell Grose. Meeting adjourned at 5:45 p.m.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as those with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) included rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Contaminants that may be present in sources water before we treat it include:

<u>Microbial contaminants</u>, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, livestock operations and wildlife.

<u>Inorganic contaminants</u>, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming.

Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as storm water run-off, agriculture, and residential users.

<u>Radioactive contaminants</u>, which can be naturally occurring or the result of mining activity. <u>Organic contaminants</u>, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and also come from gas stations, urban storm water run-off, and septic systems.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulation which limits the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. We treat our water according to EPA's regulations. Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health.

Our water system has an estimated population of 8098 and is required to test a minimum of 9 samples per month in accordance with the Total Coliform Rule for microbiological contaminants. Coliform bacteria are usually harmless, but their presence in water can be an indication of disease-causing bacteria. When coliform bacteria are found, special follow-up tests are done to determine if harmful bacteria are present in the water supply. If this limit is exceeded, the water supplier must notify the public.

Water Quality Data

The following tables list all of the drinking water contaminants which were detected during the 2022 calendar year. The presence of these contaminants does not necessarily indicate the water poses a health risk. Unless noted, the data presented in this table is from the testing done January 1- December 31, 2022. The state requires us to monitor for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. Some of the data, though representative of the water quality, is more than one year old.

Terms & Abbreviations

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG): the "Goal" is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to human health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

<u>Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL)</u>: the "Maximum Allowed" MCL is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Secondary Maximum Contaminant Level (SMCL): recommended level for a contaminant that is not regulated and has no MCL.

Action Level (AL): the concentration of a contaminant that, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements.

Treatment Technique (TT): a required process intended to reduce levels of a contaminant in drinking water.

Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL): the highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

Non-Detects (ND): lab analysis indicates that the contaminant is not detected at or above the MDL(Method Detection Limit).

Parts per Million (ppm) or milligrams per liter (mg/l)

Parts per Billion (ppb) or micrograms per liter (µg/l)

Picocuries per Liter (pCi/L): a measure of the radioactivity in water.

Millirems per Year (mrem/yr): measure of radiation absorbed by the body.

Monitoring Period Average (MPA): An average of sample results obtained during a defined time frame, common examples of monitoring periods are monthly, quarterly and yearly.

<u>Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU)</u>: a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person. Turbidity is not regulated for groundwater systems.

Running Annual Average (RAA): an average of sample results obtained over the most current 12 months and used to determine compliance with MCLs.

Locational Running Annual Average (LRAA): Average of sample analytical results for samples taken at a particular monitoring location during the previous four calendar quarters.

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children.
